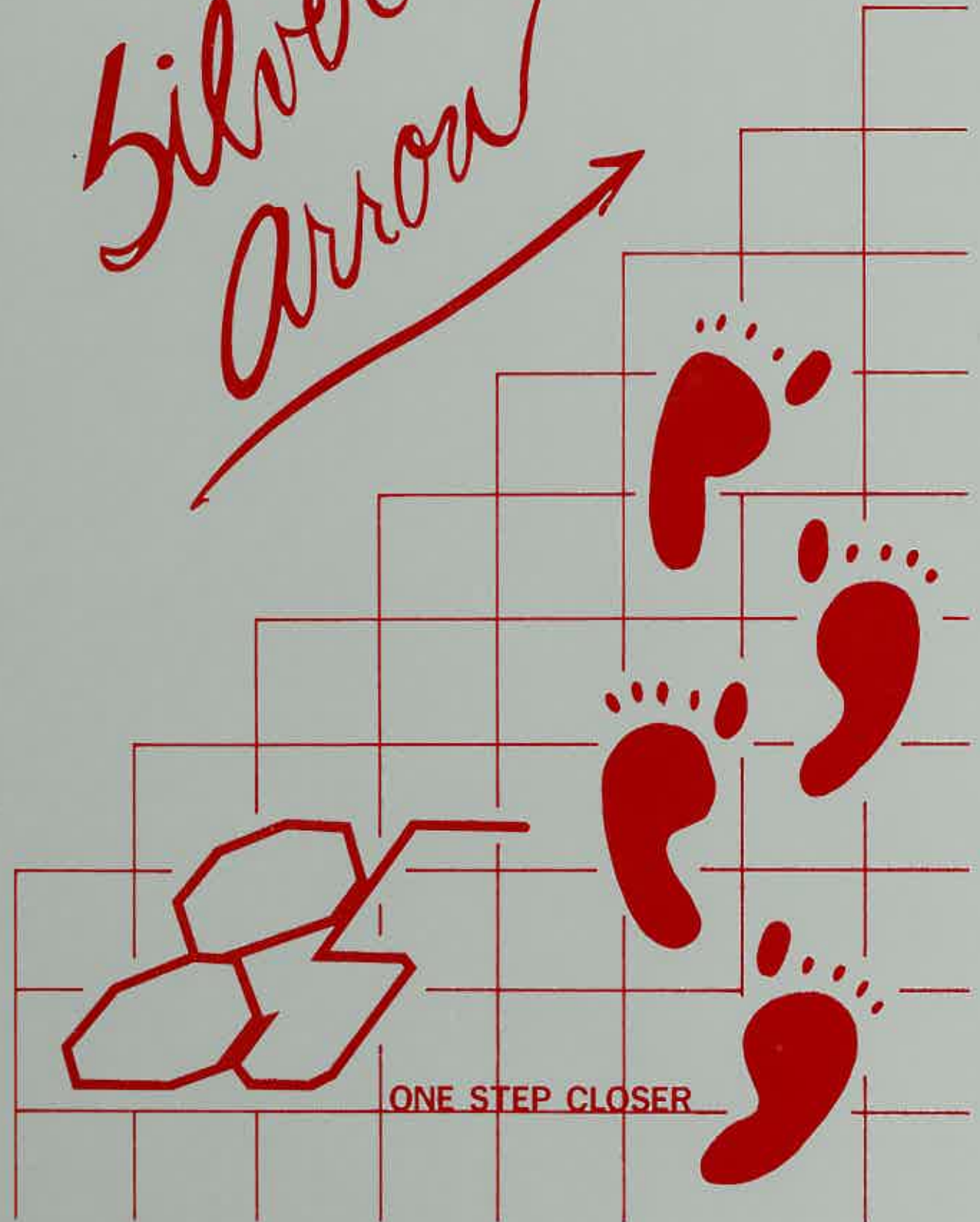

The 1984-85 Silver Arrow Staff takes great honor in dedicating this year's Silver Arrow to a patient, hardworking, and deserving teacher.

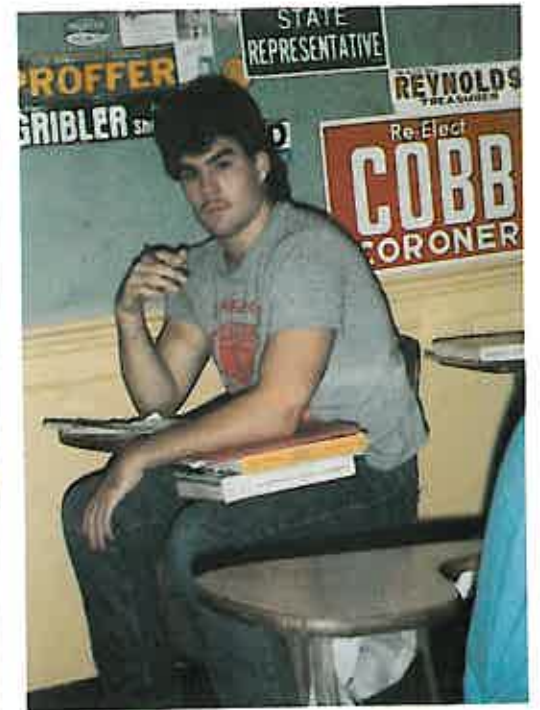

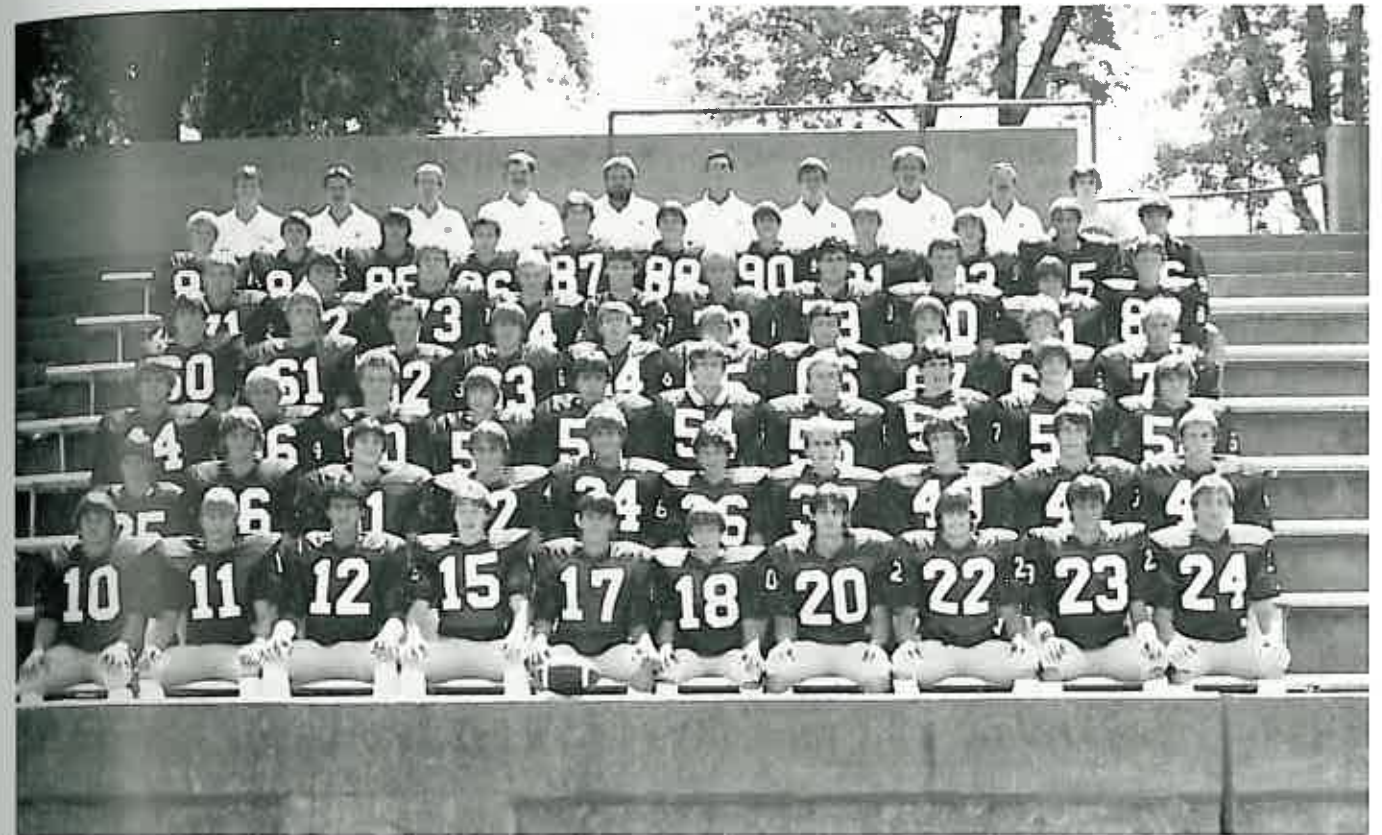
