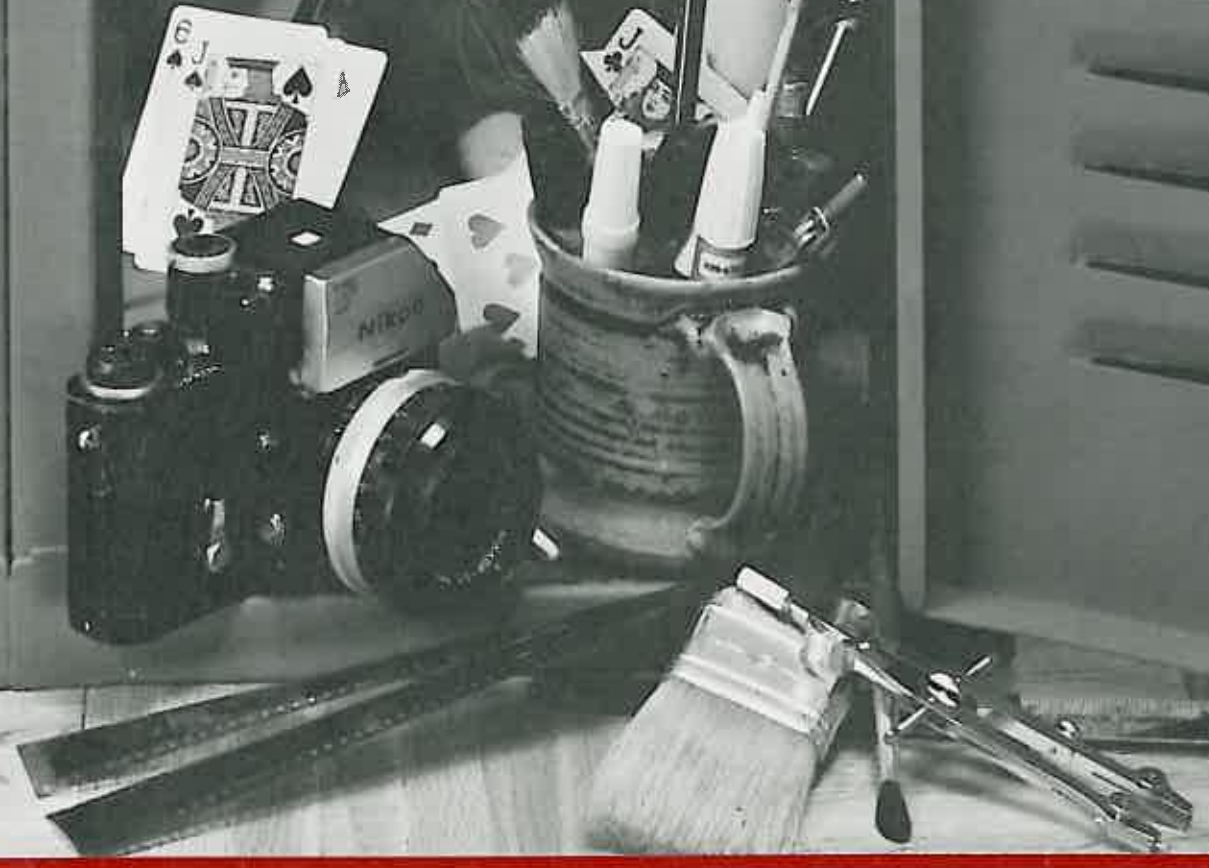

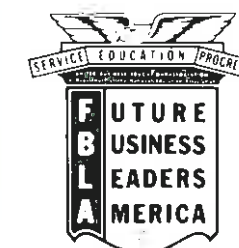

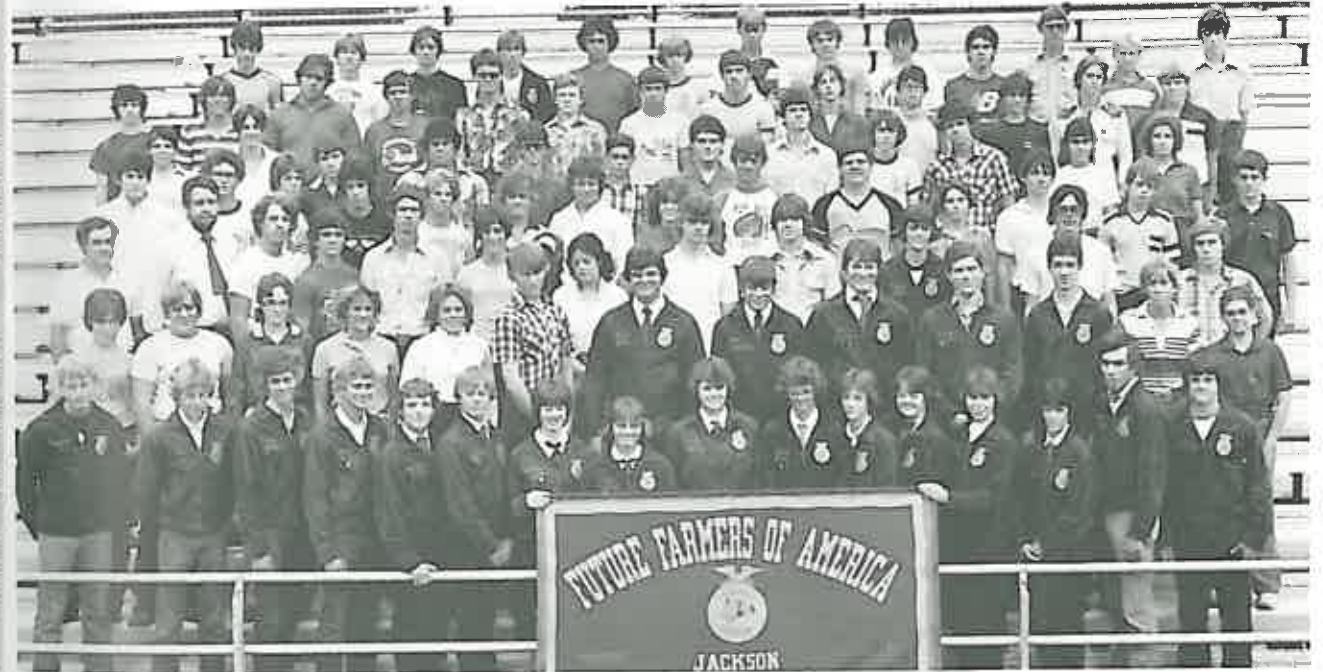
# FHA

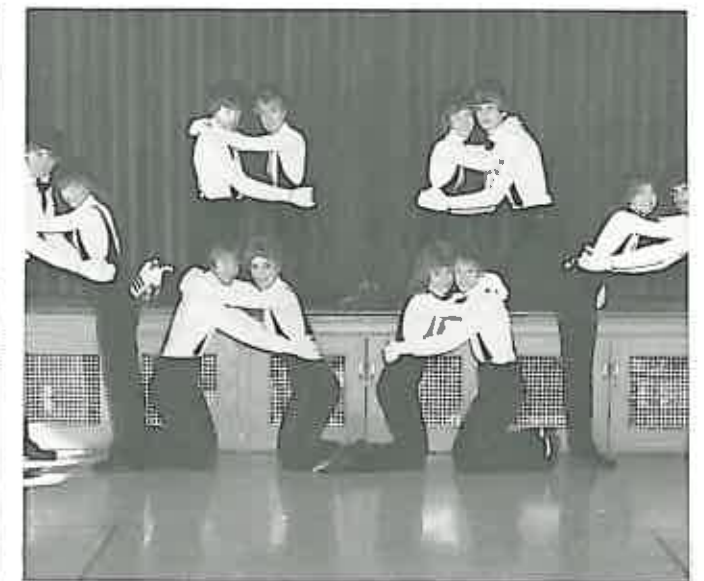

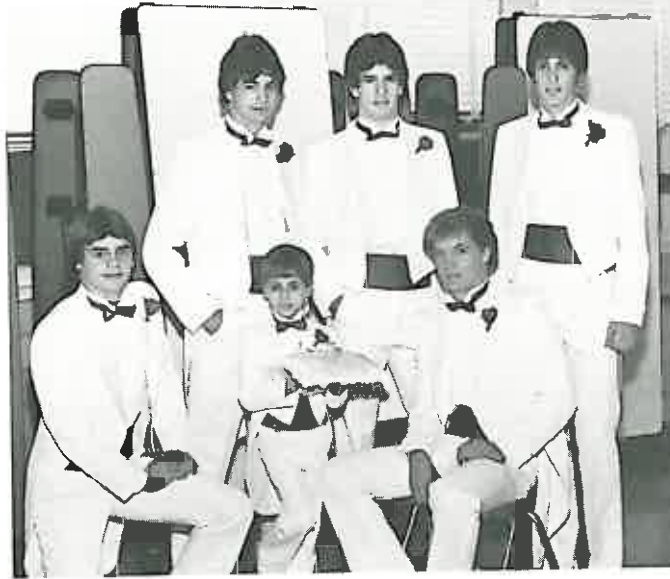

Honored as outstanding athletes at the Fall Sports Banquet were James Dougan, Boys Cross Country; Tammy Blackman, Girls Cross Country; John Paul Webber, Most Outstanding Back; Cindy Slaubaugh, Girls Tennis; and Ron Brown, Most Outstanding Lineman.



RON BROWN

Senior defensive tackle Ron Brown was named to the 4-A All-State Football team. Brown had 56 tackles including 12 behind the line of scrimmage and six fumble recoveries. Other honors achieved by Brown included All-Conference, All-District, KFVS-TV Player of the Week, and the Golden Helmet Award. He was voted Co-Captain of the Jackson Football team by his teammates.



KELLY WALLER

Senior defensive back and receiver Kelly Waller was named a defensive back on the 4-A All-State football team. His defensive statistics included five interceptions and 27 tackles. Offensively, Waller had 29 pass receptions for 404 yards and six touchdowns. He was also named All-Conference, All-District, KFVS-TV Player of the Week, and recipient of the Golden Helmet Award. 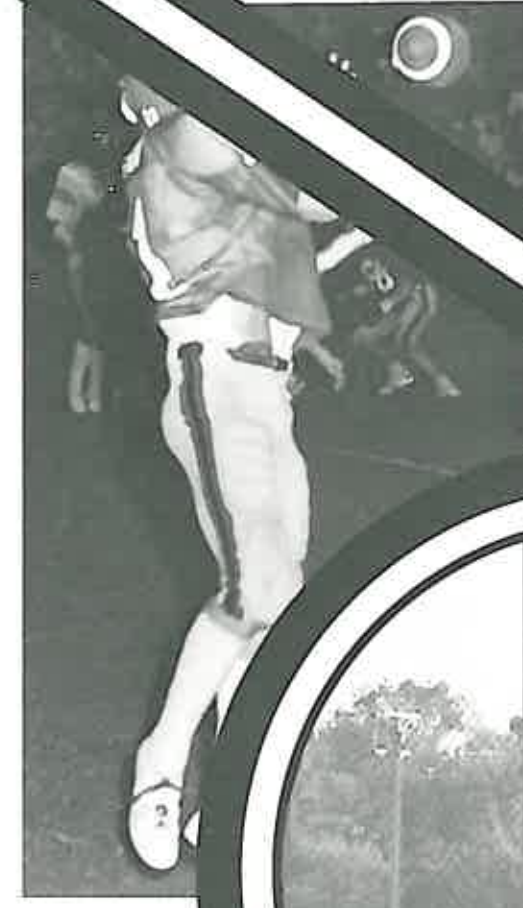
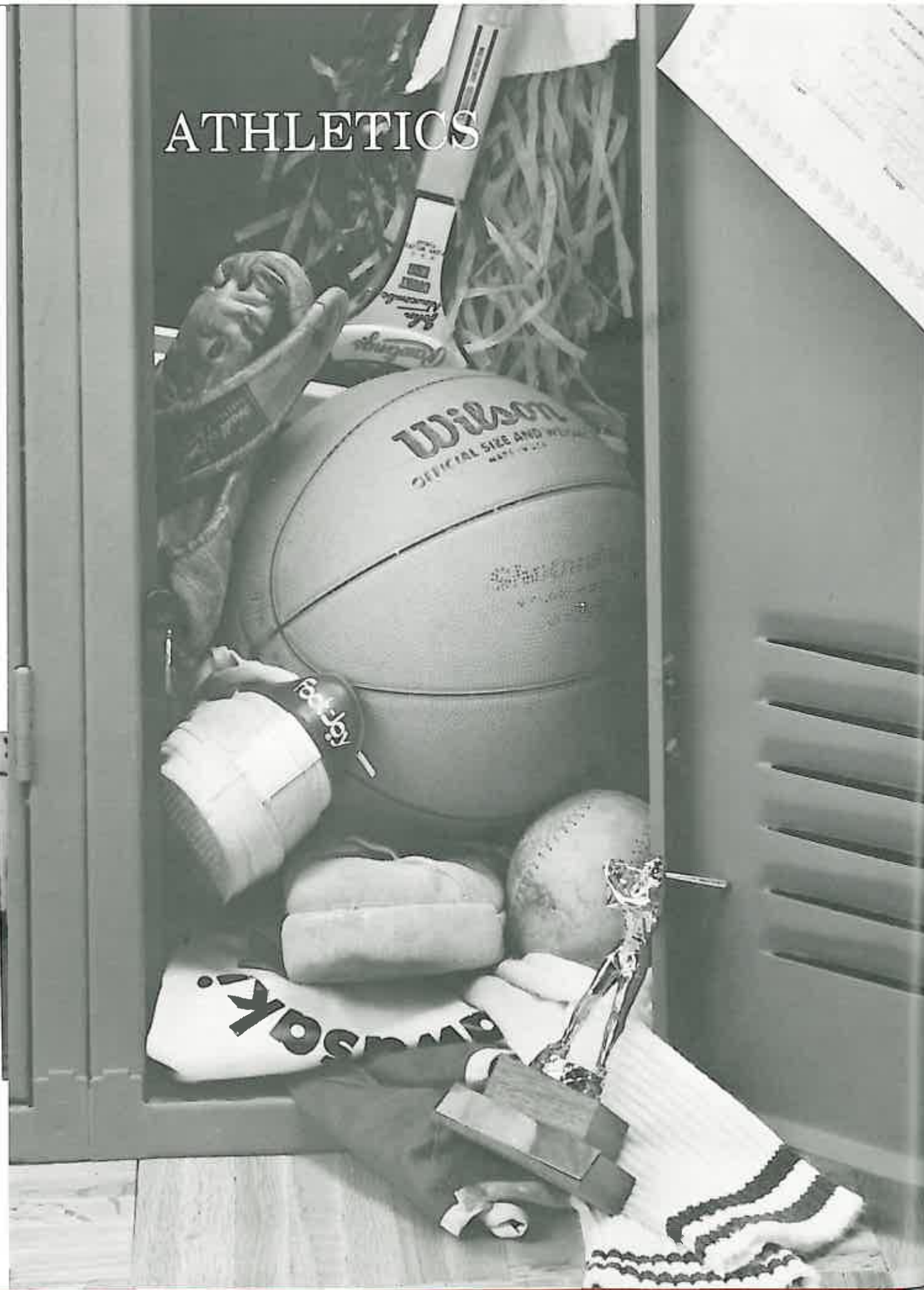


JOHN PAUL WEBBER

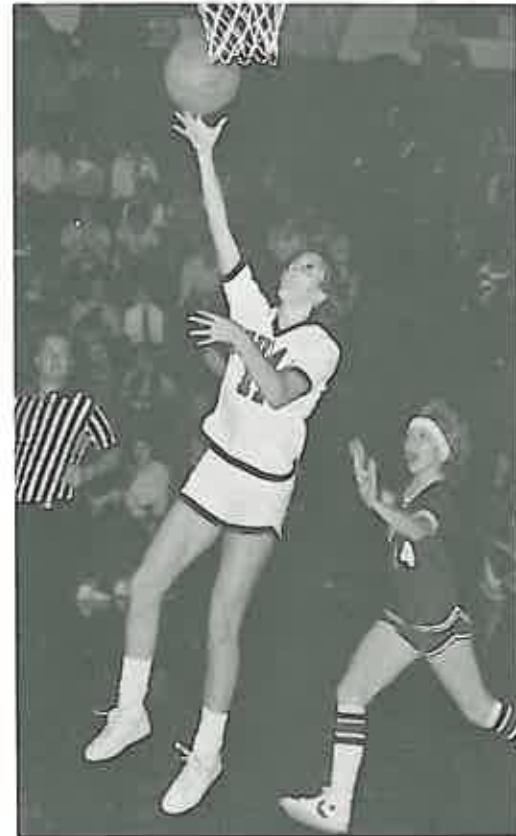

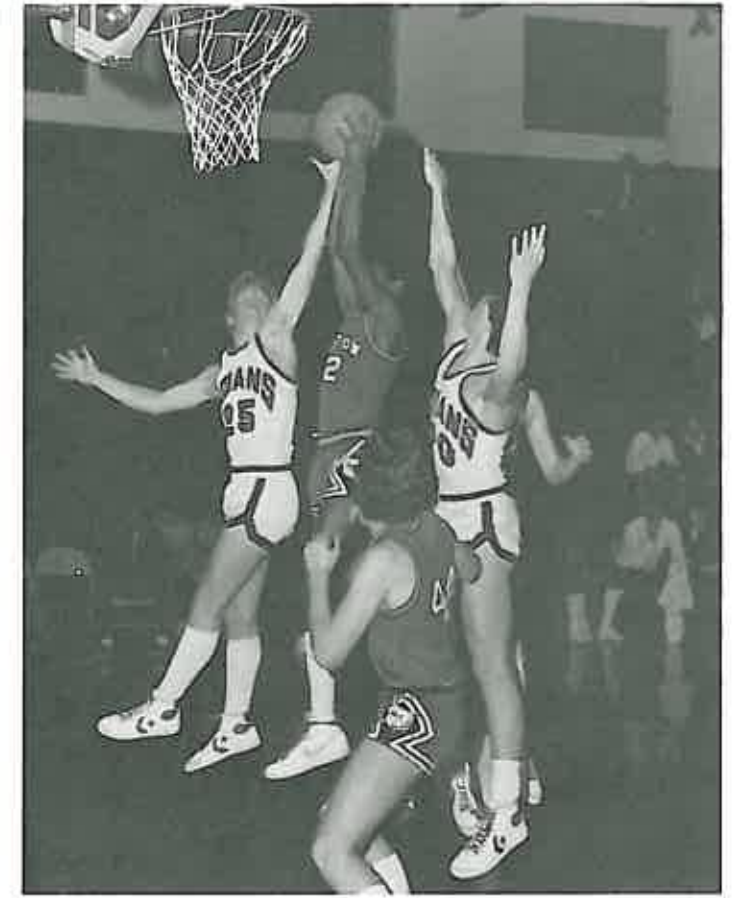
