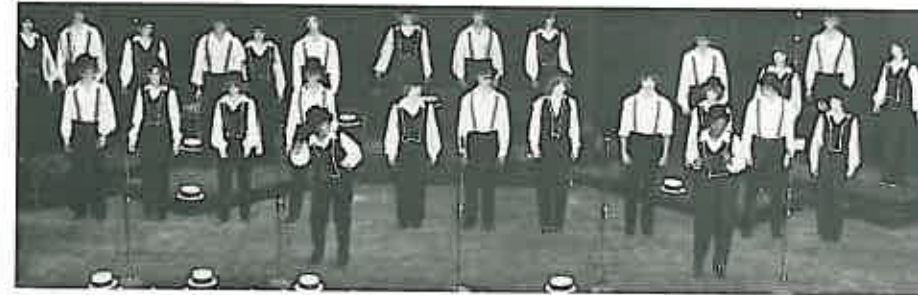
# STAGE CHOIR

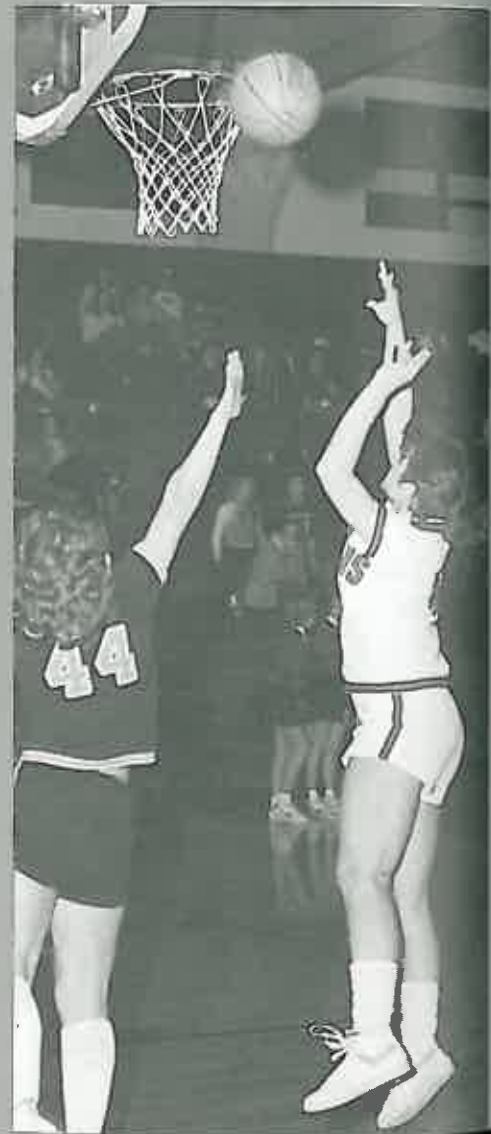

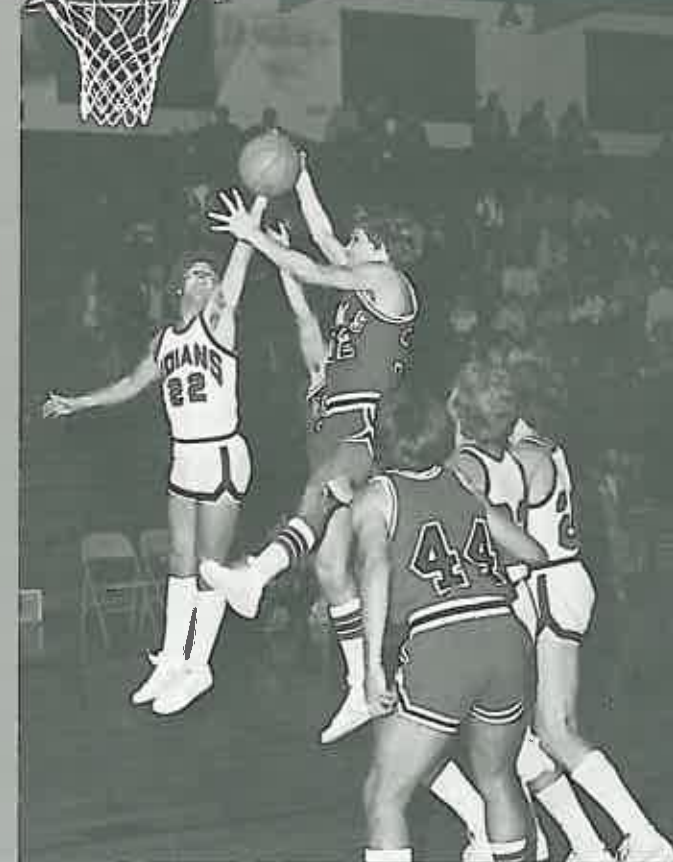
