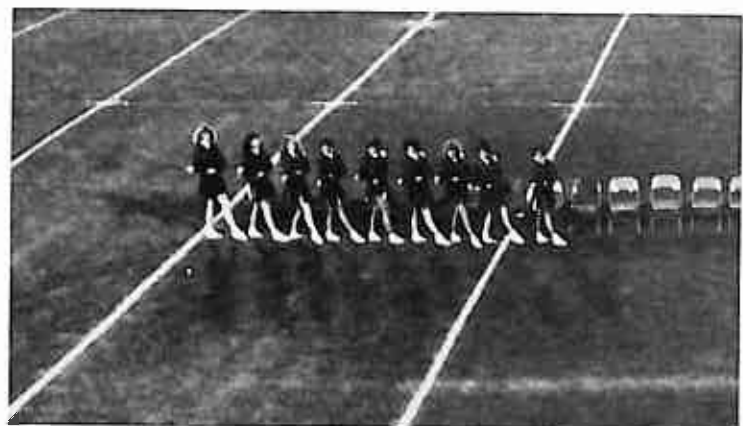
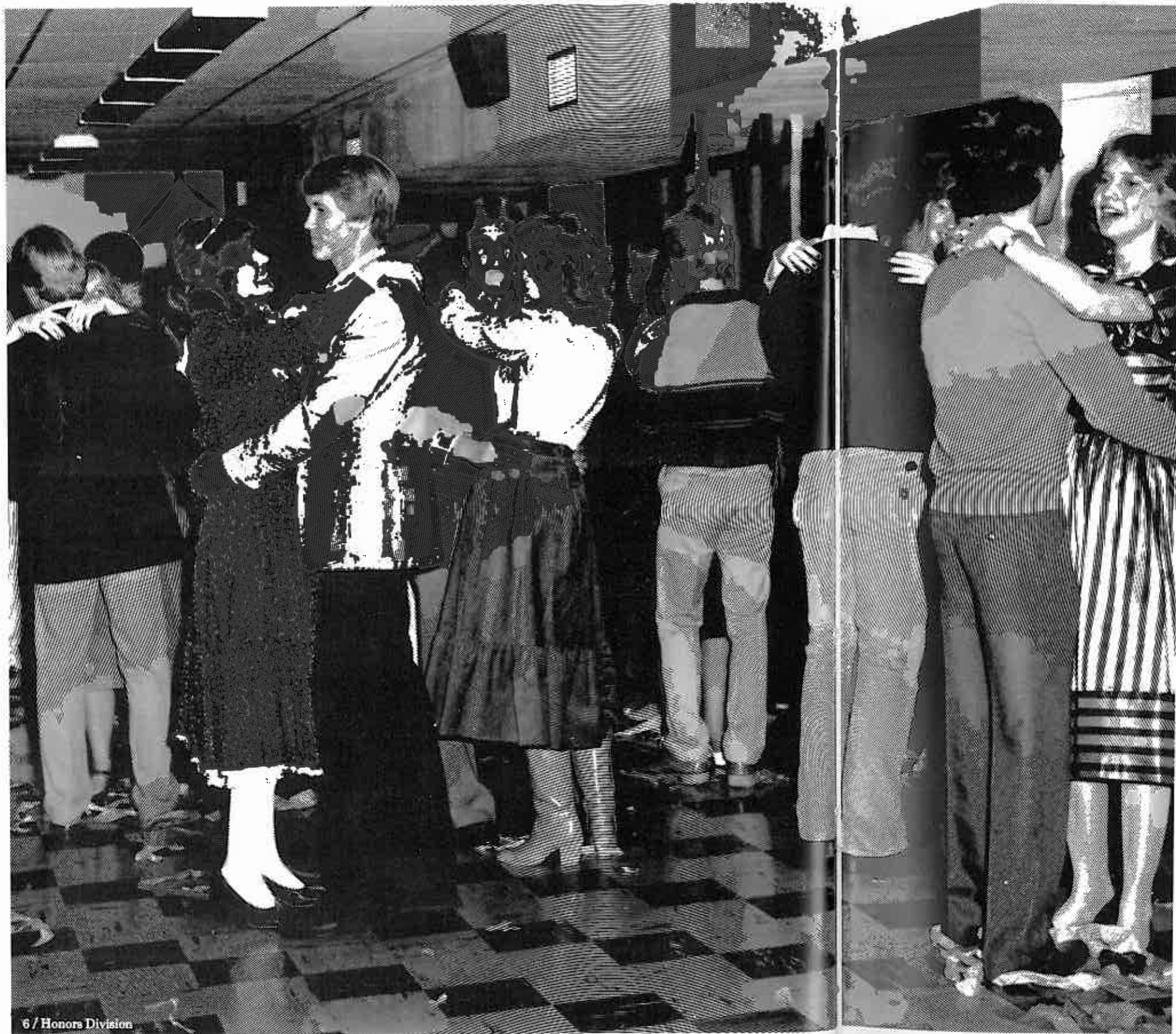

Honored as outstanding athletes at the Fall Sports Banquet were Lane Lohr, Most Outstanding Lineman; Scott Brothers, Boys Cross Country; Roger Neumeyer, Most Outstanding Lineman, Tammy Blackman, Girls Cross Country; John Paul Webber, Most Outstanding Back; and Lynette Nitsch, Girls Tennis.



Junior quarterback John Paul Webber was named Missouri 4-A Player of the Week and all State Honorable Mention. When the season ended, J.P. had compiled some impressive statistics for the record book, passing for 1,547 yards and averaging over 150 yards per game. J.P. threw 16 touchdown passes and ran for 4 more. J.P. was also named All Conference, All District and KFVS-TV Player of the Week.



Senior wide receiver Lane Lohr was named as a unanimous choice to the Missouri 4-A All State Football Team and was also named Missouri 4-A Player of the Week. Lane had 40 receptions during the season for a total of 1,033 yards, including 11 touchdown passes. His outstanding performance set a new school record for receptions. 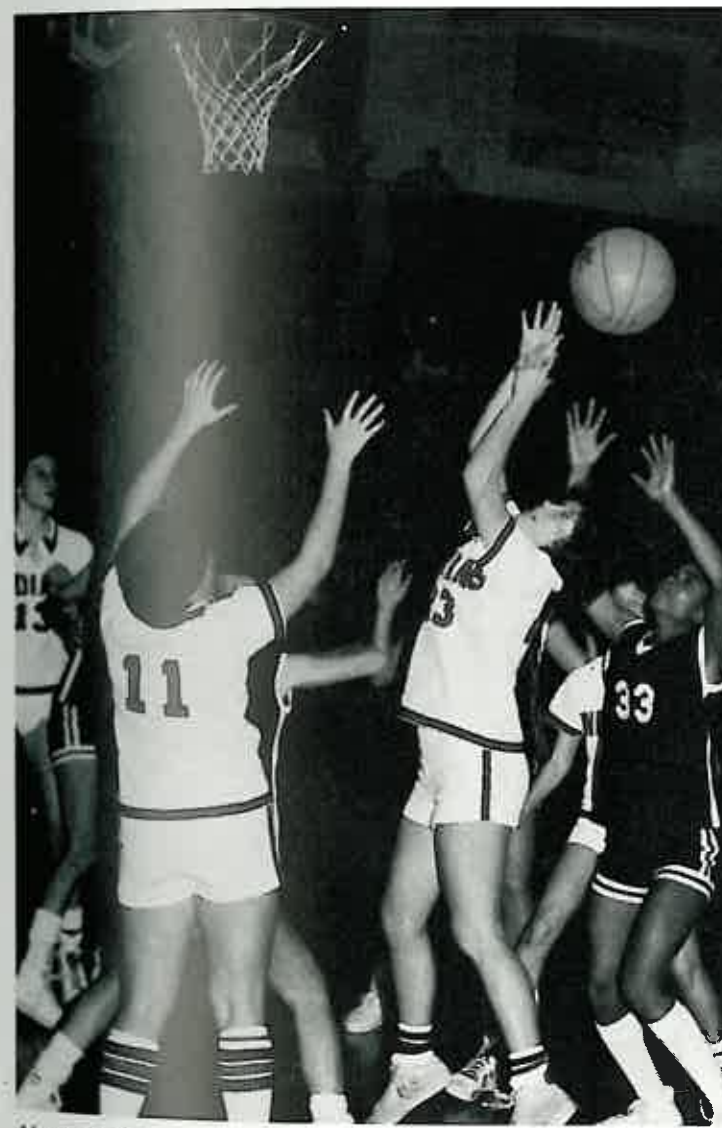

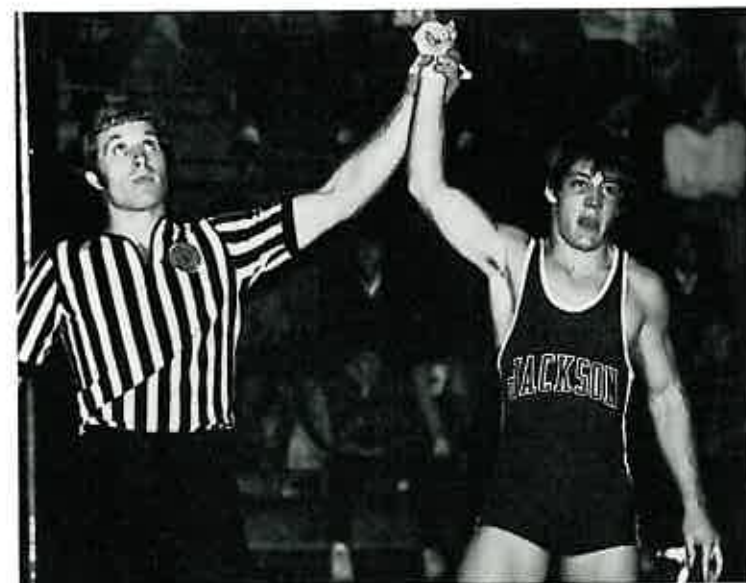

The Jackson wrestlers under the leadership of Head Coach Bruce Thomas and Assistants Bob Sink and Steve Wachter had a highly successful season. The varsity closed out the regular season undefeated in dual matches with a perfect 11-0 mark, defeating the SEMO Conference Champion Sikeston Bulldogs in the last regular match of the season.

During the season the varsity wrestlers placed fourth in the Fox Invitational Tournament, first in the Parkway Quad, fourth in the Tiger Wrestling

Classic, and second in the SEMO Conference Tournament.

The junior varsity was also undefeated during the season in dual meets, compiling a 7-0 record. In a 12-team tournament at Murphysboro, Jackson placed third and in a 10-team tournament hosted by Jackson, they placed fifth.

Jackson had two SEMO Conference Champions: Ron Brown at 167 pounds and Scott King at 138 pounds. David Sievers finished second at State.

Jackson captured the 1A-3A District Championship held at Jackson in February. The Indians qualified grapplers for regional competition in twelve of the thirteen weight divisions, including five district champions. District champions were Steve Schreiner at 132 pounds, Scott King at 138 pounds, Kyle Wright at 145 pounds, Lane Lohr at 155 pounds, and David Sievers, Unlimited. Other wrestlers qualifying were Todd Rayburn, 98 pounds, fourth; Darren Baker, 105 pounds, second; Kevin Welker, 112

pounds, fourth; Ron Reagan, 126 pounds, third; Ron Brown, 167 pounds, third; Albert Lowes, 175 pounds, fourth; and Brad Everly, 185 pounds, third.

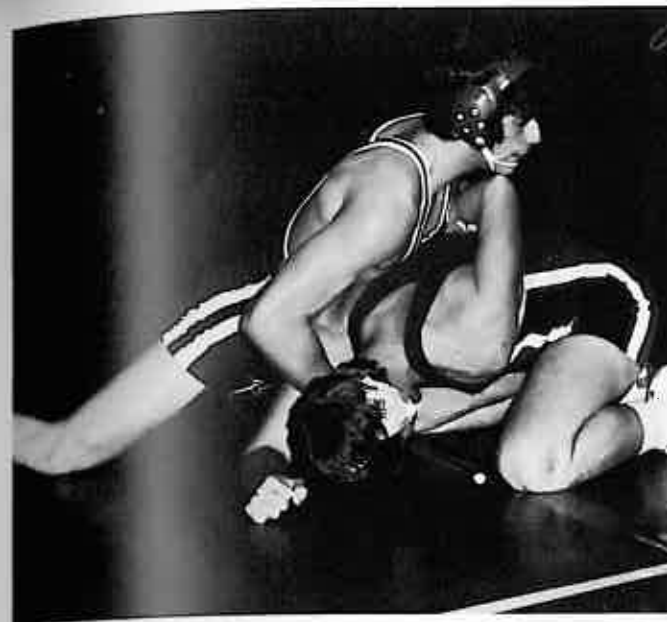
Jackson accumulated its highest team total ever, scoring 224½ points to far out-distance the second place Pacific team with 145½ points. To accomplish this, Jackson recorded pins in all but one match of the opening round and all but two matches in the second round before moving into the finals of the twelve-school tournament.



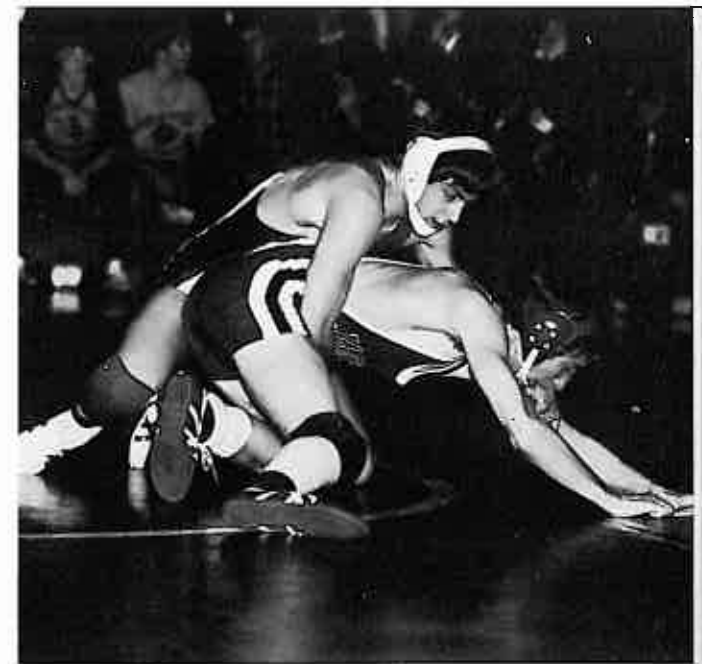

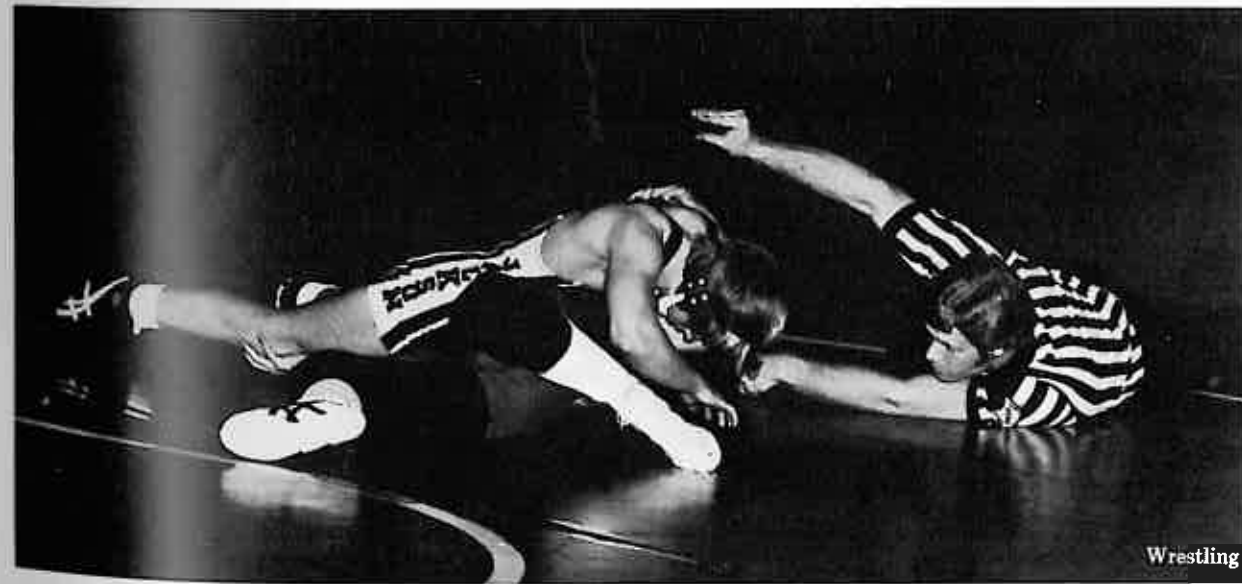

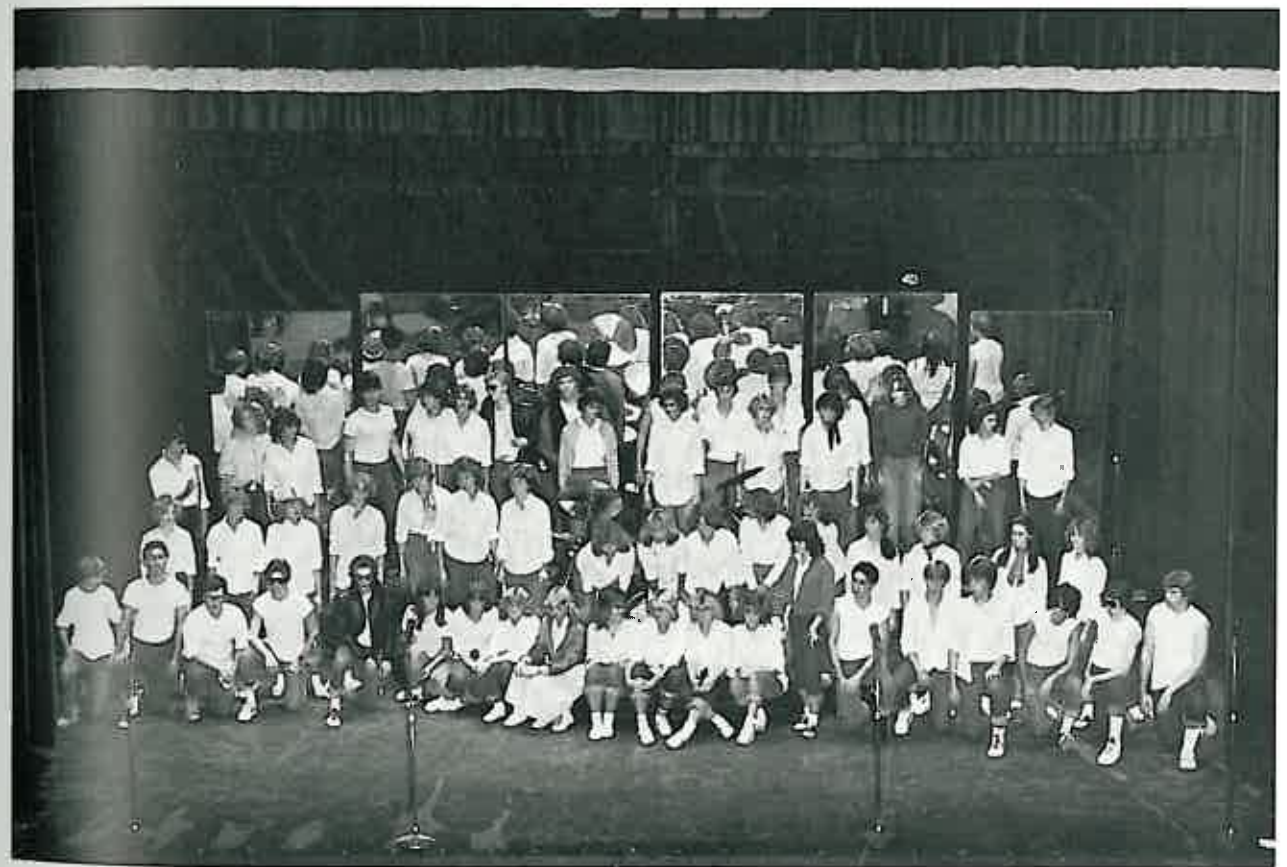

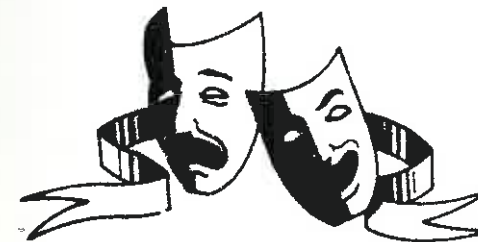
